
Data Visualization

Over the past year, our approach to data collection has evolved, reflecting our commitment to continuous improvement and refinement. As a result, you may notice "unreported" categories in each dataset, marking our ongoing efforts to enhance the accuracy and comprehensiveness of our data. We hope that these visualizations not only provide valuable insights but also serve as a testament to our dedication to transparency, accountability, and the meaningful impact of our collective efforts.

- All data presented is from the 2023 calendar year.
- With the exception of the sliding scale section which features percentages of total, figures represent the cumulative totals observed throughout the year.
- "Reservations" denote the collective sum of individual program instances scheduled over the course of the year.
- "Use hours" refers to the total number of hours dedicated to programming activities throughout the year, providing insight into the overall utilization of our space and resources.

Sliding Scale

It's noteworthy that over 50% of organizations utilizing our space fall within the lowest sliding scale bracket, underscoring our commitment to accessibility and affordability.



Sliding Scale

Importantly, this data exclusively represents organizations utilizing our sliding scale, highlighting our prioritization of supporting non-profits, as evidenced by the fact that all groups in the highest usage bracket are non-profit entities receiving discounted rates compared to commercial counterparts.










Day of the Week


Shop Use

While Shop 11 led with the highest number of reservations, a closer examination of the data reveals that these primarily consisted of shorter 1-2 hour engagements. In contrast, the STEAM set and Shop 6 demonstrates a preference for longer, more immersive programming sessions, suggesting a distinct focus on sustained participation and deeper engagement within these Shops.

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






Program Types

While movement and performance arts recorded a high number of reservations and use hours, a deeper analysis of the data reveals that other categories feature more in-depth programs with longer duration of engagement. This suggests a preference for immersive and extensive programming in these categories, underscoring the potential for further development and enrichment to meet the diverse interests and needs of our community.




Cities

Individuals and organizations in Cambridge continue to comprise the largest percentage of program reservations and use hours, reflecting sustained local engagement and support. It's notable that the significant portion of unreported locations, primarily from the first half of the year, underscores our ongoing efforts to refine data collection processes for enhanced accuracy and transparency.


Our Maker Spaces are a natural space for connection and creativity. Our Fiber Arts Studio sees the most intergenerational connections, with many seniors excited to share their knowledge with newcomers to the fiber arts.

Co-produced programs, like The Mirror's annual STEM Slam, bring together people in the STEM fields from marginalized communities to share in their experiences and offer mentorship. Participants range from school students to established professionals.





The Art Studios are another space where life-changing connections are being made. Two of our Art Studio members have started a business together since starting to work in The Foundry.



February Festival

Our first annual Foundry Festival was a success! Thank you to the thousands in attendance who came to The Foundry to take part in the multitude of Arts and STEM programs during the weeklong run. To honor the undeniable power of community voice that made The Foundry what it is today, the festival's 2023 theme was storytelling. Over 4,000 community members celebrated with us in 2023.






Program Partners


